ORDER REGARDING RELOCATION OF COURT

**GENERAL ORDER 11-24** 

On December 14, 2023, the Court found there was an immediate need to move court operations from the Bellingham courthouse for the United States District Court for the Western District of Washington because of sustained water damage due to rain. Pursuant to subsection (a) of the Special Sessions Act, 28 U.S.C. § 141, the Court ordered that beginning January 2, 2024, and until further order of the Court, special sessions of the district court would be held at the Skagit County Community Justice Center, 201 Suzanne Lane, Mount Vernon, Washington 98273.

On July 30, 2024, President Biden signed into law S.227, the Improving Access to Our Courts Act. Codified as Public Law 118-73, the Act amends 28 U.S.C. § 128(b) to permit court proceedings for the Western District of Washington to be held in Mount Vernon. Because the new law authorizes proceedings to be held in Mount Vernon, the Court's previous general order authorizing special sessions of the Court in Mount Vernon is no longer necessary. Effective immediately, General Order 13-23 is rescinded.
